


## TORONTO-BOUND!



## ECMC'S FIRST-EVER "BIKE & HIKE"

This was something new for Empire City MC, our first-ever "bike and hike" was held 9<sup>th</sup> August 2015. We met up at Lexington Candy Shop a luncheonette that serves as our usual haunt when we're travelling north-bound. We rode two hours north to the Appalachian Trail where it crossed NY-55 at GPS: 41.589973, -73.659329. You know you're not in the city when you start using GPS coordinates!

There were eight motorcycles, mostly ECMC members. Our friend Snake showed up at breakfast with a brand-new Honda Valkyrie, his new ride. I think it looked grape-purple, but he insists it's candy-red. Sadly, our day got off on the wrong



foot as Snake (gently) dropped his new bike on 83<sup>rd</sup> Street as we were just pulling out to start our ride. He was okay, but his new bike got some scratches on the right side. We're so sorry Snake! We've all been there.

We rode up the Saw Mill Parkway to the Taconic State Parkway to NY-52, NY-216 and then finally south on NY-55 for about 1.2 miles to the 'secret car park' where we parked our motorcycles and loaded up our hiking gear. I must admit, I was surprised when I turned around to see Scot looking completely different in a floppy hiking hat and checked shirt looking very much like a hiker indeed! After a few false-starts, we headed inward on the blue-blazed trail to the white-blazed Appalachian Trail heading north-east.

Mind you, none of us have been on this hike and some of us hadn't hiked in many years (if ever at all!) Trekking over unstable rocks and edges of cliffs was daunting for some of us, although exciting at the same time! After about an hour, we made it to Nuclear Lake where the trail with the yellow-blazes started indicating the lake loop trail. Many of our photos on our facebook group's photo album area were taken at this point. You could see the lake in it's full glory, keeping in mind that Nuclear Lake has been named "the most beautiful lake on the Appalachian Trail" by many.

I know what you're thinking — why would we ever want to visit a place named 'Nuclear Lake'? Let me set your mind at ease. The only reason it's even called Nuclear Lake (and I know you're going to think


Being a self-admitted geek, I brought my dosimeter (radiation detector). It only chirped with an alarm once, as we passed by a large boulder, indicating 0.50  $\mu$ Sv/h (which is about twice the natural global average background radiation), otherwise it was quite low, measuring between 0.09 to 0.15  $\mu$ Sv/h. In other words, we're not glowing. For comparison, New York City's average background radiation is 0.12  $\mu$ Sv/h.

For the most part, we all enjoyed ourselves, even if we didn't get to go swimming in Nuclear Lake. Next time, we shall! The yellow-blazed lake loop trail was very rugged for some of us – it tested our tenacity. I'm sure that this will be the <u>last</u> hike for some, other than perhaps Central Park or getting from the (2) train to the (E) train in the tunnel! Most importantly, we all survived to tell the tale!




#### SAFE AND PRIVATE WEB SURFING!

Look, we're not just bikers - many of us are professionals too! I work with computers and sadly, I see many people getting hurt from viruses, exploits, spamming, malware, adware, phishing and more. It's a scary world on and off the road!

If you're going to surf a computer, you should have protection these days! I avoid many Google products now for privacy's sake. My home page is protopage.com which allows you to configure your home screen to show RSS feeds and other items of use (like Google used to!) I also use DuckDuckGo extension as well as in the search default, as they do not track you. I use Firefox (not Chrome nor I.E.) and my standard Firefox extensions (add-ons) include:

- DuckDuckGo Plus
- NoScript (blocks scripts XXS and more) \*
- AdBlock Plus (stops banner ads and more!)
- Saved Password Editor \*\*
- Cookies Manager+
- Video Download Helper (downloads nearly anything)
- Downloads Window (old fashioned download window)
- \* NoScript is a pain to get used to and configure your whitelist at first, then you'll never know how you surfed without it!! Well worth the PITA.



With Mozilla Firefox, do take advantage of the CTRL+SHIFT+P to browse privately from time to time when you want no evidence left in your system or on theirs!

On your computer's desktop side, ClamWin (clamwin.com) is a FREE and awesome anti-virus tool. Note: it will sometimes report a false positive, which can be easily checked for free online at virustotal.com. I'd rather have a false positive, check it, then filter it than have it miss something entirely, wouldn't you?

And lastly, DO NOT SURF without MalwareBytes installed! Go to malwarebytes.org to purchase this tool, it's the best!!
