





Drama in the Leather Contest World!

For those of you who enjoy drama, here's an interesting story that's been brewing.

Drummer was a male-only porno magazine from 1975 until 1999. In the beginning, it was the embodiment of what masculine leathermen aspired to. At mid-point, the magazine was sold and the new owners tried to include other areas of gay life and it lost its original focus on the leather-clad leather-daddy and leather-boy image which made it so popular. By it's end, it had been diluted to such a boring magazine that couldn't hold a candle to Honcho.

From 1981-1999 Drummer Magazine held a "Mister Drummer" leather contest, since contests were an up-and-coming thing thanks to International Mister Leather (IML) in Chicago. But when the magazine went tits-up, so did the contest.





Years later, in comes a person (whom I shall not name), who's had his crooked fingers in many areas of the contest circuit, leaving a trail of broken promises, debt and disillusioned men in his wake. He buys the rights to "Drummer" for use with "Drummer Contests".

After some time, Drummer North America (DNA) stops hosting its contest and merges with the International Leather Sir/Boy (ILSB) – that is until there was allegedly a fight between the contest owners. DNA resumed



with a lot of bad blood between the two. Something to do with women, men and transgendered people and the contest community, or so I hear...

Now let's get to what's been happening since January 2018:

Jack MacCullum lives in the New York City region and holds a Drummer North America (DNA) title. He's also the victim of an alleged harassment campaign from an unknown source but appears to have its roots in the DNA/ILSB scuffle. Jack has been getting death threats, alleged fake bombs, a dick glitter bomb (a box, that when you open it, penis-shaped glitter bits go flying everywhere) and recently a hateful postcard mailing scheme where his photo has been altered to be like a clown and multiple messages of hate written on the back (see photos above). Your threats and attempts to embarrass me truly are childish and amateur. Move on. Do your own thing. Seek help and guidance. I actually feel sorry for people that see that something is not for them, but continue to try to ruin it.

For those wondering about the threats coming from this anonymous person(s) over the past four months, 'Tina's Army' is most likely the source. People so angry and bitter over something they cannot control or own. It's sad anyone would use threats, harassment, intimidation, and manipulation in an attempt to control an individual or organization. I can't say all of them are culpable but there is at least one.

Many Americans Have a Shortage of "Social Capital"

A high percentage of Americans lack community and social support structures. According to the Department of Commerce, the United States economy grew 2.6 percent in the most recent economic quarter. This is strong economic growth. And according to the Labour Department, the unemployment rate held steady at 4.1 percent in March for the sixth month in a row. Economists consider this number to be near full employment.



And yet we all also know that not everything is going in the right direction in our country. Today, a lot of our communities are struggling with challenges like addiction, family breakdown, and isolation. The economic numbers that our government collects do not provide us with a full picture of American life.



Social Capital

Genuine human connections are the foundation of a happy life. They occur at home but also in the community in churches, civic groups, neighbourhood gatherings, and workplaces.

Just as social capital is important for each of us as individuals, so too is it important for the life of a community.

Social scientists refer to these connections as "social capital" to illustrate that they are a resource every bit as precious as money. Indeed, more precious. Just as social capital is important for each of us as individuals, so too is it important for the life of a community.

So where is civil society flourishing, and where is it struggling?

This week the Social Capital Project released the Social Capital Index—the clearest picture ever taken of the health of American communities, state by state and county by county. You can read the full report here, but below are a few of its findings. Where Are We Struggling?

We'll start with the bad news, which will not be news to many of you: Social capital is not distributed equally in our country, and lots of American communities are struggling with challenges like addiction, family breakdown, and isolation.

Churches and civic groups are not the support network and wellspring of meaning and moral education that they once were. States in the South and Southwest have the lowest social capital scores, plus a few states in the North like New York.

In many areas of these states, the institutions and values that support healthy relationships have broken down. Churches and civic groups are not the support network and wellspring of meaning and moral education that they once were. This breakdown of community has left individuals to fend for themselves in increasing isolation.

Sadly, many more Americans live in these struggling communities than in flourishing ones. Three times as many Americans (29 percent) live in the weakest 10 states than live in the strongest 10 states (9 percent).

It's Not All Bad News

But there are bright spots as well. States with high social capital tended to be rural states in the West, Midwest, and Northeast. We are better prepared to address important policy questions about family breakdown, drugs, and crime.

Our state, Utah, had the highest social capital score because of its stable families and commitment to helping the less fortunate. Utah ranked first out of the 50 states and Washington, D.C., for family unity, social support, and philanthropic health.

The Social Capital Index is not a competition so much as a tool. Now that we have an understanding of what social capital is and where it is concentrated, we are better prepared to address important policy questions about family breakdown, drugs, and crime.

As we look at Utah's first-place finish in the index, we should think to ourselves, "What has Utah done right? And how can we use this knowledge to help our neighbours in need, both within Utah and across the country?"






