

Pop in your TARDIS and go back to the gay leather bars of the 70s

Oh, the glory days! Mandatory leather dress codes at the door, slings in use over the bar, very active back rooms, cigar smoking leathermen with chaps, boots, harnesses, caps and all the sweat that goes with it. If you were you alive in the 70s or 80s and remember this scenario, you're blessed. Gentrification and "inclusion" (I use in quotes, as it really does just the opposite for leathermen) have crushed the leather bars in New York City. When we tell stories to the next generation of men, their eyes open in disbelief at the stories simply because they have never experienced anything quite like The Mineshaft, the original NYC Eagle, The Spike or other classic NYC leather bars.





Well, you can relive these experiences (or live them for the first time) when you go to "Easter in Berlin", a weekend of leather debauchery in Berlin, Germany. Thousands of leathermen descend upon Berlin days before the Easter weekend loaded with energy drinks to keep them going for the next seven days. Last month, I visited for my very first time and was very impressed with what I saw.

I particularly enjoyed the fact that mobile phones are naysayed from the get-go, as you can see in the photo above, which I stealthfully took of a placard on the bar top at "New Action" which reads "This is a place for talking, drinking and fuck." I wish I could have taken photos of the bar, the back room, the piss trough and the men that were there – but it's not allowed. It wasn't allowed at any of the venues, and rightfully so!

I did manage to snap photos of the Puppy's Walkies on Sunday morning. This contingent of pups and handlers is a drop in the bucket of the number of leathermen there.

Over 7,000 leatherman went to "Snax" a leather sex/leather dance party at Lab.Oratory, a disused four-floor eastern German industrial manufacturing plant which has been converted into a multi-dance floor, multi-play room, 40+ slings, piss-tubs and more space for men only. The photo on the right is of the two lines awaiting entry to snax – the lines died down about 3am but the party went on until noon the next day. Think about it: 40+ slings and 7,000+ leathermen. Oh my! (in a George Takei voice)





I'm still awe-struck from everything that went on and the sheer number of venues and events for the weekend – many not in the official programme. Many I can't even write about in this article!

If you're a leatherman or are into leathersex and have never been to Berlin, book your ticket now – seriously. This place is everything that we used to have in New York City before the crackdowns and disneyfication of the city. They make me want to learn German and move there!

Biker-wear is what now?

The dress-code at the "BOG Biker Party" at Scheune in Berlin read "no textiles". Odd. I wondered what they meant as I showed up in my boots, 501s, chaps, shirt, colours (vest), harness, leather arm and wrist bands, muir cap and leather jacket with overlay – the typical way I would ride my motorcycle. The denim overlay, 501s and t-shirt were verboten! They were the textiles. Well, this is how I ride motorcycle, how do *you* ride motorcycle? Easy! A leather onesie or two-piece riding suit! Gay leather bikers evolved differently in Germany than in the United States. They embrace the entire leather-clad suits for riding, not the Leather/Levi design adopted here. They allowed me in and they were all dressed in full riding suits – it was sexy and different. I still wonder how easy it is to take a piss when wearing one of those suits though!



A motorcycle is what now?

Do you remember the article a few months ago about what defines a motorcycle (a/k/a is the Slingshot a bike or a car?) Well, it seems we're not the only people asking that question, as National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is also seeking clarification regarding the proper definition of a motorcycle. Letter sent to NHTSA Seeking Clarification on the Definition of a Motorcycle

The Motorcycle Riders Foundation would like to thank Congressman Michael Burgess (TX) and Congressman Tim Walberg (MI) for a letter they sent this week to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) seeking clarification regarding the definition of a motorcycle. In addition to Congressman Burgess and Congressman Wahlberg, the following U.S. Representatives joined their colleagues in signing the letter: Congressman Troy Balderson (OH), Congressman Doug Lamborn (CO), Congressman Collin Peterson (MN), Congressman Steve Stivers (OH) and Congressman Glenn "GT" Thompson (PA). The current definition is decades old and so broad that new vehicles on our roadways, with numerous carlike features, are defined as motorcycles.

"As you know, NHTSA has long defined a motorcycle as a 'motor vehicle with motive power having a seat or saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground.' While this was a clear characterization for many years, the recent emergence of a new class of vehicle that has attributes of both automobiles and motorcycles has created confusion," the members wrote. "We respectfully request a response that describes whether NHTSA believes the current federal definition of a motorcycle is appropriate and if not, what NHTSA is doing to address this issue."

The ambiguity of the classification of these new vehicles as either motorcycles or autocycles has created a patchwork of rules and regulations at the state level for licensing, registration and insurance. The MRF believes that a review of this definition is needed and would help provide clarity to states when making decisions on how to appropriately regulate them. We thank these seven members of Congress for seeking clarification from NHTSA on this issue of importance to motorcyclists.

President of the MRF, Kirk "Hardtail" Willard, stated "For three years our members have asked us to tackle the federal definition of a motorcycle. This letter is the first step in helping us understand the current thought process of NHTSA and hopefully opens up a dialogue on the topic. We thank this bipartisan group of Congressmen for their leadership on this issue."
