



The Rochester Rams MC Calls It Quits


Gay motorcycle and/or leather clubs are like non-renewable resources, once they are gone, they are gone. As you can see in the letter below, The Rochester Rams has closed shop.

The Rochester Rams has been in existence since the early 70s, based out of Rochester, New York and was a frequent guest at Empire City MC events in the 80s, 90s and beyond. Now, as you can read below, they have closed shop. The Rochester Rams MC were one of the clubs decimated by AIDS in the 80s, but survived. They also survived Vietnam, Reagan, Bush Sr and Bush Jr, the death of all three original owners of the Bachelor Forum (their home bar),




even the gentrification and female invasion of the Bachelor Forum under its new ownership who really never supported the Rams like the previous three did. Several huffy members left and formed other clubs, such as L.O.L.A. (The Lake Ontario Leatherman Association), G.H.L.A. (The Golden Horseshoe Leather Association), even a sex club known as the "Barn Parties" seemed to originate from confrontations with the Rochester Rams. A former president, Rich Richards was under our watchful eye and cared for as best we could whilst he died from liver cancer. In our darkest days, we made panels for the AIDS Quilt for some of our fallen members – the number of deceased members is heart-breaking.

The Rochester Rams had a motion on the table to dissolve the club once before in the late 80s due to the fact over half our members were in hospital with AIDS. In 1987 a valiant effort to do something fun, anything fun to change our moods and make us proud once again of our damaged club, we pretty much forced every able-bodied member to attend the Tribe MC's Annual "Do-A-Fool" Run in April 1987 with the plan of taking 1st place participation, proudly bring the trophy back to Rochester! Members who couldn't afford the \$80 run fee were paid for by the club - we were determined to win! There was strong competition from our splinter group, L.O.L.A. At the slave auction, L.O.L.A. pooled their "fuck bucks" and bought Walt Dyer, our President at the time. A certain L.O.L.A. member, who's still alive today was heard yelling at Walt: "Ok, boy - now it's time for some dickwork!" - Walt looked back at us while carried away by L.O.L.A. with the same expression that Dabney Coleman had on his face at the end of film "9 to 5" when he said "Brazil?" This happened because we needed to host a cocktail party, participate in the scavenger hunt, play all the "people games" and enter the slave auction in order to gain participation points to snag 1st place. We won. I was so happy that upon returning to the Rams' home on Laurelton St, I ran up to the attic to show Richard Bradbury, a former president of the Rams the trophy and I tripped and the trophy tumbled down the stairs and fell apart! The trophy you see in the case at the Forum was re-constructed!



The Rochester Rams were the source for so many stories, memories and friends – and all the tangible items that trigger these memories of these things will be given away, or possibly thrown away.





Dear Associate Members and Friends of the Rams,

It is my sad duty to inform you that the members of the Rochester Rams voted unanimously to dissolve the club per the rules of our Constitution. Some may already be aware of this from the public posts on our social media accounts.

While we appreciate the support given by the community over the years, that support has waned, and membership has fallen, to persistently low and untenable levels. Despite spending time, money, and effort to broaden our outreach, participation in events such as bar nights and the toy drive have declined. It was our fervent hope that younger members of the community would step up, but with only one exception, newer members have not committed to the club.

The timeline for dissolution follows:

- June was the final bar night
- the club will dispose of physical assets during July and early August
- items with historical value, such as club banners will be sent to the Leather Archives (note that all photographs, newsletters, and other records were scanned and sent to the archives earlier last year)
- the website and social media sites discontinued by the end of August
- remaining funds donated to charity and the bank account closed by the end of August
- dissolution completed by the end of September 2019

We ask that all associate and lifetime members keep their patches and continue to wear them. If you have personal items stored in the clubhouse, please contact us immediately to coordinate their return. Please contact us if you would like any photographs, awards or other items as souvenirs.

The 25th Annual Arktos Bear Run, entitled "Good Times at the Silver Saloon" will be held at Freedom Valley Campground in New London, Ohio Friday the $2^{nd}-4^{th}$ August 2019. Empire City MC has reserved the only eight-man, airconditioned bunkhouse at the campground during the run and this is the last call for accommodations in the private cabin.



In 2018, Empire City members had a great time at the 24th Annual Arktos Run and we had agreed that we'd go back in 2019, but because the trip there was so long, we agreed to break the outbound trip into two portions make the long haul easier and arrive at the campground earlier. This year we'll leave New York City on Thursday, 1st August and ride to the United 93 National



Memorial (something we've longed to see), afterwards we'll stay overnight in the Pittsburgh, PA area at our friend Michael N's home (which is very similar to The Ranch in Hemlock, NY – lots of beds, a bar, decks, hot tub, pool, etc.)

We'll depart from Michael's home in Coal Centre, PA and head on a mixture of highways, interstates and back roads to Freedom Valley Campground, along with some of our other motorcycling friends from Three Rivers MC.

If you're interested, there are several injection points and coming by motorcycle is not mandatory, although the ride portion is. You can meet us at the Run Site, United 93 or in Coal Centre – we just need to know where to expect you.

If you're interested in going, here's what you need to do:

Contact Chaz Antonelli at ChazAntonelli@gmail.com to reserve a bed (if any remain) and he will send you a request on PayPal for \$83.00 for the single bed. Once you have confirmed and paid your accommodations, pay the \$125 Arktos Run Fee online at: http://bit.ly/Arktos2019 (this pays for food, drink and other amenities at the run). When you get to the campground, pay \$10 for bedding (if you didn't bring your own) and campground membership fee (if required). Let me know where you will meet us up.

Some people have expressed concern over the cost of the run fee, but please keep in mind this is food, drink and admission for all Run Events all weekend long. You may stay in the cabin during the run without paying the run fee; however, you will not get any of the run amenities such as meals, beverages, run kit, etc. The run fee is separate from the cost of accommodations in the cabin. You can alternatively pay the run fee, bring a tent and not pay for accommodations in the cabin.


Armand Receives an Award

The Great Flood of New York

Trapped behind the Adirondack Mountains and a tremendous ice sheet, glacial Lake Iroquois was three times the size of modern Lake Ontario. Then, 13,350 years ago, the natural ice dam collapsed. Floodwaters rushed down the Hudson River Valley; past modern Manhattan, Brooklyn, and Staten Island; through an earthen dam where the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge now stands; and across another hundred miles into the North Atlantic. The water level in Lake Iroquois dropped 120 meters (400 feet), and rocks the size of Volkswagens moved hundreds of miles downstream.

Beyond reshaping the landscape, the catastrophic flood also had dramatic impacts on Earth's climate. It may have triggered a brief but global period of colder climate known as the Intra-Allerod Cold Period, said Jeff Donnelly, a geologist at Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution. The torrent from the glacial lake would have thundered into the North Atlantic, adding a vast freshwater "lid" on the ocean surface that could have rearranged ocean circulation and changed climate patterns, said Donnelly, who is a fellow of

both the Ocean and Climate Change Institute and the Coastal Ocean Institute at WHOI.

Scientists have long suspected that large discharges of glacial water into the ocean could drive climate fluctuations, but linking discharge events like the Hudson flood with individual climate changes has been difficult because of the challenges in pinpointing the location, timing, and amount of the discharges.

Donnelly and colleagues analysed sediments from the Hudson River Valley, which extends under water on the continental shelf (see map). On huge sediment lobes on the shelf, where sediments are normally the size of sand grains, they found car-sized boulders—which were likely pushed there by the great flood.

The team also analysed ancient pollens deposited by the flood in sediments near the Tappan Zee Bridge and the Holland Tunnel, as well as walrus fossils buried by the flood in the offshore sediment lobes. The results precisely dated—for the first time—the discharge from Lake Iroquois and linked it to the Intra-Allerod Cold Period.
