



### ECMC's 2020 Motorcycle Weekend a Success During COVID-19!

Our 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Motorcycle Weekend in the Finger Lakes region took place this past Memorial Day Weekend. We waited until the very last moment to commit to the event, or cancelling it outright due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our first priority is the health and safety of our hosts, guests and members, so it's not needed to be said that we were very concerned of having a gathering of twenty people in a confined space. We had a multiple-point checklist (including regular touch-less IR temperature checks) to ensure (as best we could) our hosts, guests and ourselves were free of COVID-19 plus we enforced a no outerwear/footwear policy inside of The Ranch during the entire event. We did not want anyone getting sick because of our event, and I'm happy to report that two weeks following the event, no symptoms have been reported from any of our members, guests nor hosts!

The weekend was packed with fantastic people from Philadelphia, Baltimore, Pittsburgh, New York City and elsewhere! The only rain encountered on the entire trip (whilst we were riding) was a light mist for about half an hour as we were in the Horseheads, NY area as we headed up towards The Ranch – it was so light that the road remained dry.

My very own husband, K.K. once again planned feasts twice daily for everyone, simply amazing food which was enjoyed by all. We had a "Cards Against Humanity" game going on Saturday night for several hours, the bar was hopping and the playroom was quite active as well! We treated the entire property as a sterile zone, keeping everyone as safe as we could.

We went on rides around the Finger Lakes area every day! With so many businesses closed, or operating under special to-go only environments, we focused upon outdoor sites such as Niagara Falls (US side only), Mt Hope Cemetery (where we saw the graves of Susan B Anthony and Samuel Douglass), many craft beer breweries in the area (who all offered to-go cans and growlers), Highland Park, the birthplace of the Mormon religion (the Joseph Smith farm in Palmyra, NY) and many, many other sites which can be seen from *outside*, with our masks on, safe from crowds!

We owe a world of gratitude to our hosts, Al Rizzo and Dan Marty for trusting us with their home in these harrowing times. Nearly everyone at this event had been locked in their own homes for over two months, terrified of getting deliveries, going grocery shopping, or even to open a window to get fresh air. This wonderful weekend where we could actually socialise with reduced fear of getting infected was thoroughly appreciated.

## Six Years of "Rumblings"



## How To [Safely] Carry A Concealed-Carry Gun On A Motorcycle

There’s no “one size fits all” approach to riding a motorcycle with a concealed carry pistol. A lot of how you can learn to be comfortable riding a motorcycle with your CC pistol is taking a look at how you’re situated on the bike.

Three basic seating configurations (with a lot of varying extremes) are:

- Forward leaning
- Upright
- Backward leaning

Depending on your motorcycle ride style, this will change where you can fit a concealed carry pistol in your waistband. And overall, we do recommend you ride with an Inside the Waistband (IWB) holster that offers high-retention. Wherever you wind up holstering, make sure it’s in a place that will stay with you no matter where the bike goes.

### 1. Forward Leaning Motorcycle Concealed Carry Styles (Racing, etc.)

Motorcycles that require you to maintain a strong forward leaning position can make it tricky to keep it on an Inside the Waistband (IWB) concealed



carry holster. For these situations, if you're able to get a pocket holster and fit it to the inside chest of your jacket, you can reasonably guarantee it's secured.

The only other available space is behind the back in a radical 5 o'clock or 6 o'clock position. In terms of concealed carry holster placement, this isn't particularly ideal. Unfortunately, it will print heavily depending on how you ride. It's also not in the most secure location for high speed and sharp manoeuvring.

If you think you'll be traveling at a fast rate of speed and making sharp turns, secure your pistol in a pocket holster secured within the chest pocket of a thick motorcycle jacket.

## 2. Upright Motorcycle Concealed Carry Styles (Touring, etc.)

With an upright seating arrangement, you have a wide degree of choices. Ideally, the most comfortable for an IWB holster will usually be within a 4 to 5 o'clock (around the kidney) or strong-side carry (3 o'clock). Because of where your legs are aligned, appendix carry isn't much of an option.

If you're bringing a passenger along for the ride, have them straddle you as they normally would and just give them a heads-up as to where your firearm is situated. No matter where they are, they shouldn't be situated in any way, shape or form so their body crosses the muzzle of the gun. That shouldn't be too difficult given the above recommendations.

## 3. Backwards Leaning Motorcycles (Custom Choppers, etc.)

Some motorcycles can put you almost in a fully reclined position.

This allows you to reasonably attempt an appendix carry depending on the size of your gun. If that's not comfortable, try a strong-side carry. For this riding style, that's the ideal position for an inside the waistband holster. Alternate suggestions are like the forward leaning motorcycle tips – pocket holster within the chest pocket of your jacket. If that's not possible, always ensure it's locked into a high retention holster.

## 4. Final Considerations for Motorcycle CCW

Your riding style, your motorcycle, your gun – your rules. That said, whenever possible always try to ensure that your firearm is kept in either a pocket holster within a zipped coat pocket OR a high-retention kydex or leather IWB holster. This ensures positive pressure is applied to the firearm in a safe manner.

Here's a few other brief suggestions:

- Always secure the trigger guard inside a holster of some kind.
- Always keep the firearm on your person unless you plan on locking it in a cargo box.
- Never wear a holster that lets your gun flag other drivers (or your passenger).
- Ankle holsters aren't helpful for motorcycle rides.
- Try out different positions until you find one (or two) that work best with your riding style.
