SCENE

The Provincetown Run, needless to say, is Entre Nous' traditional and historic yearly event; that it is coupled with the Club's anniversary in a spirit of congeniality and great brotherhood. It is an event where the effort is minimal, as even club members can enjoy a weekend run without the fanfare and work of an in-city event. The rustic Cape Cod setting along Provincetown's waterfront, friendly people, good food and drink, warm autumn sun and great nightspots provide an ideal site for a run which has become very popular among other club members and independents. Who could possibly want to give it up?

SCENE II

Enter AMCC rule: Article I, Sec. 2 which states "to limit public social events, lasting longer than one day, to one per year, per member club, and to coordinate the calendar dates of these events." Entre Nous is a member of the AMCC and therefore obligated, like any other member club, to follow the rules, since its other major run is Equinox held in the Spring of each year.

PROBLEM I

The majority of Entre Nous members and, perhaps, a great many associates do not want to give up the P-town Run. While Equinox is held to sustain the coffers yearly, the P-town Run is held to celebrate an

anniversary; an event for club members to enjoy the benefits of hard work all year long. The consensus is that neither event would be given up, one for the other. To not give up one run. goes against the AMCC ruling, and that's exactly where the shit hits the fan. The remarks are "damn the AMCC," and "why should they tell us what our own club wants to do?"

PROBLEM II

The Thunderbolts MC were called on the carpet at the last AMCC meeting during the Clympia IV Run for violating the very same rule. They had advertised a two-day anniversary and, summarily, held the actual event which was not sanctioned by the AMCC. Action is pending perhaps; at least, no one will know until the next AMCC meeting at the forthcoming Marathon Run.

REQUEST DENIED

Entre Nous, which is sensitive to listen to its own club members yet conscious of its own good standing in AMCC, especially where some of the other member-clubs are banner clubs, approached the Council to vote a waiver of the rules to allow F-town '75. It went further to request a date which did not conflict with another sanctioned run date. However, the request was denied last month.

NITTY GRITTY

If the T-Bolts are not reprimanced in a decisive way, it will show a weakness on the part of the AMCO, and the one-per-club rule could be further abused by other clubs, therefore destroy the whole concept and purpose for having a co-ordinating council. The T-Bolts could resign from the AMCC as they have informally threatened to do. Therefore, the rule would maintain respect by the rest of the council members. Entre Nous certainly has no quarrel with the Thunderbolts as they are our banner club in brotherhood. The outcome of their plight does not affect Entre Nous, only the precedent which may be established should the AMCC not take definitive action. Either way, in light of the feelings of its own members with regard to the Provincetown kun, Entre Nous will be forced to make an important decision.

Sentiment is mixed on both sides that the matter cannot be taken to lightly. The AMCC is a viable organization but its strength is only going to be determined by its willingness to be as sensitive to club members just as much as Entre Nous must listen to its own membership.




