





RECIPE INGREDIENTS:

5lbs bone-in pork loin roast ½ green pepper, fine chopped ½ cup thin sliced green onions ½ cup chopped celery 8 garlic cloves, minced 1 tsp. salt 1/4teaspoon cayenne pepper

CARLIC PORKROAST RECIPE BY SECRETARY ROSS STREITION

RECIPE INSTRUCTIONS:

Cut a deep pocket between each rib on the meaty side of the roast.

In a bowl, mix the green pepper, green onions, celery and garlic.

Stuff the mixture in the roast pockets.

Sprinkle salt and cayenne pepper over the roast.

Place roast in a shallow roasting pan, with the stuffing side up.

Roast at 350°F for 1½ to 1-3/4 hours or until a thermometer inserted in the pork reads 145°F.

Remove roast from oven. Cover with foil.

Let it sit for 15 minutes before carving.





2024 Elections: Nominations Report

Summary

Nominations for five Board positions and six Committee positions were initially accepted via email, text, and phone call from July 20 to August 3. In response to member feedback, the Nominations co-chairs decided to share the list of nominees with the membership on August 8 so that the community could see the candidate list and consider making additional nominations. More submissions were accepted at nominations@spearheadtoronto.com email address until 10PM on Friday, August 9. After taking additional nominations from the floor at the August 10 Open General Meeting, a motion pass passed to close nominations.

Nominations were submitted by 16 of the 46 full members, and we are pleased to report that none of the election's 11 roles will likely be vacant once election results are announced. Based on the list of nominees, members will be asked to elect three Board positions: Vice-President, Treasurer, and Membership Director. The other eight roles have been acclaimed.

Candidates have the opportunity to campaign the membership directly using up to one full page in the October edition of Phalia, space on a dedicated nominations page on the Spearhead website, and through whatever other mechanisms they wish to pursue. The submission deadline for the "election issue" of Phalia is October 11.

Balloting will take place from October 18 through November 1, and successful candidates will be announced at the November Annual General Meeting.

Rationale for Recruiting Five Board Members

Instead of Seven The Affiliation's revised Constitution and Bylaws have not yet been finalized or approved but propose to reduce the Board of Directors from seven positions to five. Due to this proposed change and the planned timing for their vote and implementation, the current nominations process did not include two Board positions specified in the current Spearhead Constitution: Director of Publications and Director of Operations.

This decision was due to the nominations co-chairs' concern that the annual election and the vote on the new Constitution may coincide, making it difficult to recruit nominees for two positions that may not exist on or near the November 2 Annual General Meeting. Our rationale for recommending the election of five Board roles instead of seven was as follows:

Current provincial legislation allows not-for-profits to operate with as few as three elected Board members (President, Secretary, and Treasurer).

The newly-proposed Publications Editor role (which would be a Committee role) can serve as the Director of Publications, effectively leaving only the Director of Operations role vacant.

If the revised Constitution does not pass or is delayed, a byelection can be held to fill the outstanding Director of Operations role.

On June 8, 2024, the co-chairs provided their rationale to the Board of Directors, and asked them to help determine how many Board roles to recruit. On June 10, the Board decided to proceed with the election of five Board members. It is important to note that no roles have been eliminated. They still exist but have been intentionally left vacant until the work on revised Constitution and Bylaws is complete.

Recommendations

We respectfully submit the following recommendations for future Nominations chairs:

- 1. Make the nominations process as open and transparent as possible. Several members expressed frustration during the nomination period about not knowing who was running for positions and which roles were at risk of being left vacant. In response, the Nominations Co-Chairs decided to share the nominees list with the membership on August 8, including a link to an update, online document outlining the results of any newly-submitted nominations. This strategy provided clarity for members and encouraged an additional four nomination submissions. In the future, we recommend providing a live, visible dashboard of nominees from the beginning of the nominations process. This can be done in a straightforward way using a tool like Google Docs, and our version of it is available online.
- 2. Do not enforce any specific nomination submission method. Traditionally, nominations have been submitted using either a paper or PDF form. Members reported having difficulty with the PDF that was distributed over email, and concessions were made to ensure nominations could be submitted. The co-chairs accepted simple email nominations, and one nomination over text message. In all cases, an audit trail was available. We see no reason why nomination submissions can't be flexible, and suggest an online form as an additional, easy method for accepting nominations.
- 3. Align nomination and election dates and timelines with Phalia deadlines. Successful campaigning by nominees will rely on the ability to share their platforms with the membership. The nominations co-chairs validated their proposed timeline against the Publications Editor's newsletter submission dates to ensure that nominees would have ample opportunity to share their views and goals.
- 4. Do not let past practice constrain what is allowed by current Bylaws. We believe that every opportunity should be provided for members to make and accept nominations, for the overall benefit of the club. During the nominations process, some members shared myths about nominations that are not backed by the current Constitution and Bylaws. We respectfully point members to the sections labeled NOMINATIONS and ELECTIONS, and recommend that the nominations process not be limited any more than those rules specify.

We trust that we have upheld our responsibilities in accordance with the current rules for nominations and elections, and look forward to continuing to serve until the next Nominations appointment is made in Spring 2025.

Phalia is the name of the newsletter produced by the Spearhead Leather/Denim Social Club. The newsletter format changed over the years, but consistently documented Spearhead events and provided information on the work of this group. Issues of Phalia covered the Spearhead annual events such as Round-up and Toys for Tots, as well as other events including the boat cruise, Paint-Yer-Burger, Pride, and the Mr. Leather contest. Many of the events Spearhead hosted were to raise money for Toronto-based charities.

Newsletters also covered events of similar clubs in Canada and the United States and highlighted issues related to AIDS awareness, the bathhouse raids, and the community and lifestyle of Spearhead members.

Issues of Phalia are also held at the Leather Archives and Museum in Chicago; the University of Western Ontario; and Bishopsgate Institute in the UK.

toronto_archives World Pride was held June 20-29, 2014, in Toronto. This marked the first time this international event had been held in North America. World Pride was about honouring the past, celebrating the present, and hoping for a positive future. World Pride was licensed by InterPride and was run by Pride Toronto. World Pride events in Toronto included an opening ceremony, an international human rights conference, there was an exhibit on the 45th anniversary of the Stonewall riots, a mass wedding of 115 couples, 280 entries in the Pride Parade and more that 10,000 marchers.

To celebrate World Pride Spearhead created its own pin. Pins and patches created by Spearhead were for its members only. Its emblem is recognized across the world.

EVERYTHING MAKES ME LAUGH A Narrative in Six Parts (19+) A Multimedia Immersive Experience (work in progress)



THING MERUCE EVES WINDERS WAKE ME LAUGH IMMEE

Here's a follow-up to last issue's article about my installation at the Inter/Access Gallery titled "Everything Makes Me Laugh (a narrative in six parts)". As you'll see in the accompanying photos, the installation was an immersive experience in a gallery space measuring 39'x18'x15'. Along with Peter Dudar's documentary film "Bruce Eves in Polari" (Polari was the lost language of gay men), the projections filled three walls from floor to ceiling and some of the floor. The fourth wall was handed over to a display of 40 or so photographs from a 136-image portfolio that was the basis for this installation. In addition, there was a nine-minute excerpt from my forthcoming spoken-word album (on vinyl, of course) "Bruce Eves Dirty Queer" booming in the gallery's lobby. I'm pleased to say that the reactions were entirely positive, with comments in the guest book such as "Fab Brave and Bold Bodacious Bad Ass Show!" "Extremely thought-provoking. Fascinating imagery which draws from a deep well of emotion." "Incredibly evocative, as art in its best form should be!"



The event was curated by Perry Voulgaris and Kelly McCray, with the Augmented Reality projections designed by Debbie Deer and strikingly documented by Tania Anderson. This was a first preview of a much larger installation that will be pitched to art museums across the country, and was made possible with generous funds from the Canada Council for the Arts.

Good day Phalia readers! Can you believe that we are in the last half of summer? I hope your Pride, Canada Day and Civic Holiday were safe and enjoyable.


